Documentation to Serve Refreshments and/or Meals
at Meetings Being Charged to Sponsored Projects

Entertainment costs are normally an unallowable expense on sponsored projects. Business meals may not be charged to the project when individuals decide to have breakfast, lunch, or dinner together when no need exists for continuity of a meeting. Such activity is considered to be an entertainment cost. In contrast, a formal group meeting being conducted in a business atmosphere may charge meals to the project if such activity maintains the continuity of the meeting and to do otherwise will impose arduous conditions on the meeting participants. The following information serves as adequate and reasonable documentation for such costs on a sponsored project.

NOTE: Alcoholic beverages *cannot* be purchased from grants or contracts, publicly or privately funded.
